What is Safe Routes to School?

Safe Routes to School (SRTS) is a partnership between local governments, schools, neighborhoods and community organizations that advocates for and implements programs to make walking and biking around our neighborhoods and schools fun, easy, safe and healthy.

Safe Routes to School focuses on "The 5 Es"

Engineering

 Propose and make changes to the built environment to create safer, accessible conditions for walking and bicycling.

Education

 Imparts safety skills, creates safety awareness, and fosters lifelong safety habits and active living.

Encouragement

•Includes events, contests and rewards that increase the popularity of walking and bicycling, and emphasizes fun!

Enforcement

•Increase awareness of laws protecting children walking and bicycling to school, and to improve driver behavior.

Evaluation

 Know where your SRTS program is starting from and tracking progress over time.
