Cascadia Behavoral Healthcare Inc is making a capital reinvestment construction investment to an existing clinic, The Garlington Center, located at 3034 NE MLK Blvd. The construction project will enlarge the exsisting facility by adding additional floors above the clinic. The new construction will include low-income housing for those with mental illness meeting HUD requirements. Funding will be a capital investment for new low-income disablity housing.

Program Summary

Cascadia Behavioral health Inc is a non-profit Behavioral Health Organization. The Garlington Center is speciality Mental Health Outpatient clinic serving a majority of individuals with Medicaid benefits. The capital reinvestment construction project will add additional square footage for residential low-income housing above the existing clinic. The primary population for the low-income housing will be for those with disabling mental health diagnoses meeting HUD requirements.
