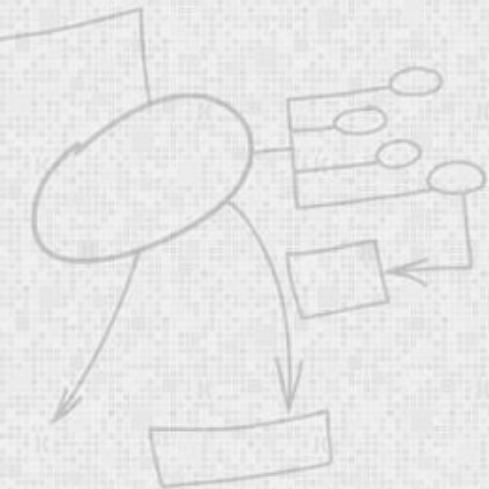
VISION & MISSION

GOALS & OBJECTIVES

OJJDP Definition of a **GOAL**:

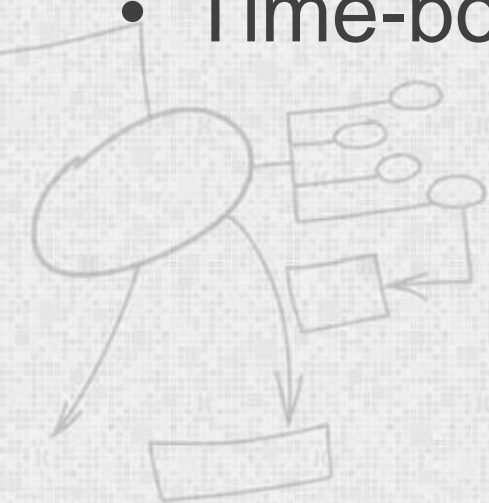
- General statements of desirable outcomes
- Desired **END**, not **MEANS** to the end
- Determine overall direction, not specific activities



GOALS & OBJECTIVES

OJJDP Definition of an **OBJECTIVE**:

- Specific statements of desired outcome
(without detailed information about the process)
- Measurable
- Time-bound



GOALS & OBJECTIVES

SAMPLE GOAL:

Alleviate community residents' fear of gang activity.

SAMPLE OBJECTIVE:

Reduce the level of gang-related property crime in the target area by 20%, as measured by law enforcement crime data and community residents' perceptions, by the end of Year One of the project.

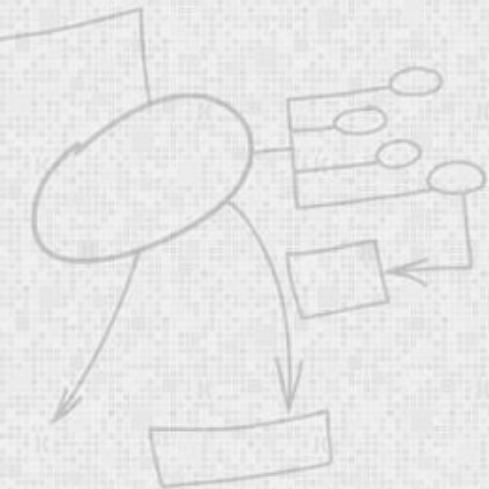
GOALS & OBJECTIVES

Coordinate systems of care and public safety using a trauma-informed approach and data-driven decision making to:

- 1) address root causes of violence in our community
- 2) intervene at the first sign of risk and respond effectively when violence does occur
- 3) repair and restore our youth, families, and communities that have been affected by violence
- 4) reduce recidivism rates for focus population

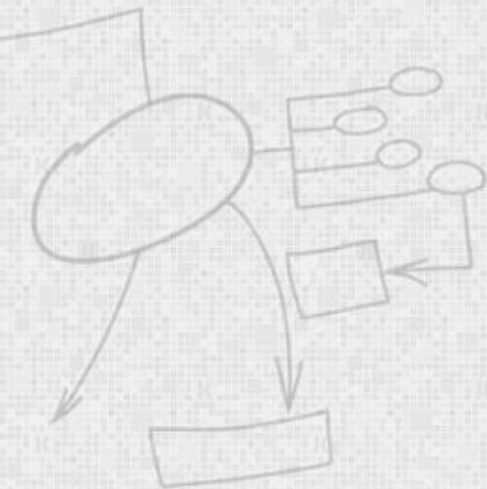

FOCUS COMMUNITIES

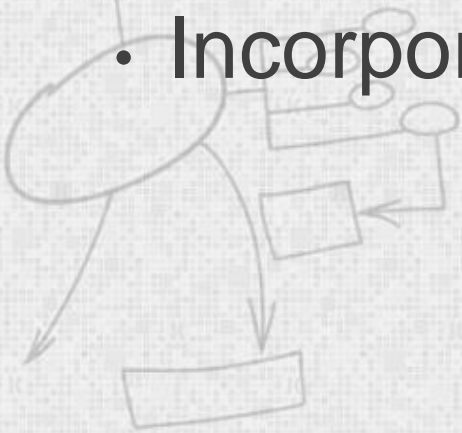
OJJDP RECOMMENDED CRITERIA

- have a population of no more than 100,000
- geographically contiguous
- clear geographic boundaries
- a sense of community identity
- most heavily affected by gang-related violent crime

FOCUS COMMUNITIES

ADDITIONAL CRITERIA

- based on data from the assessment
- leverages existing efforts, such as STRYVE
- considers existing programs
- Incorporates community input

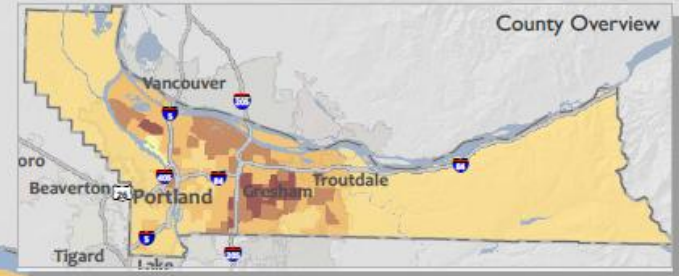

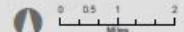
Methodology:

Categories were developed through a reclassification of factors into High, Med and Low Risk. These risk levels were translated into numbers in preparation for combining into one composite layer. Thus giving way to a range of 10-30 in scoring. Areas approximate Census Tracts.
High=3 Med=2 Low=1

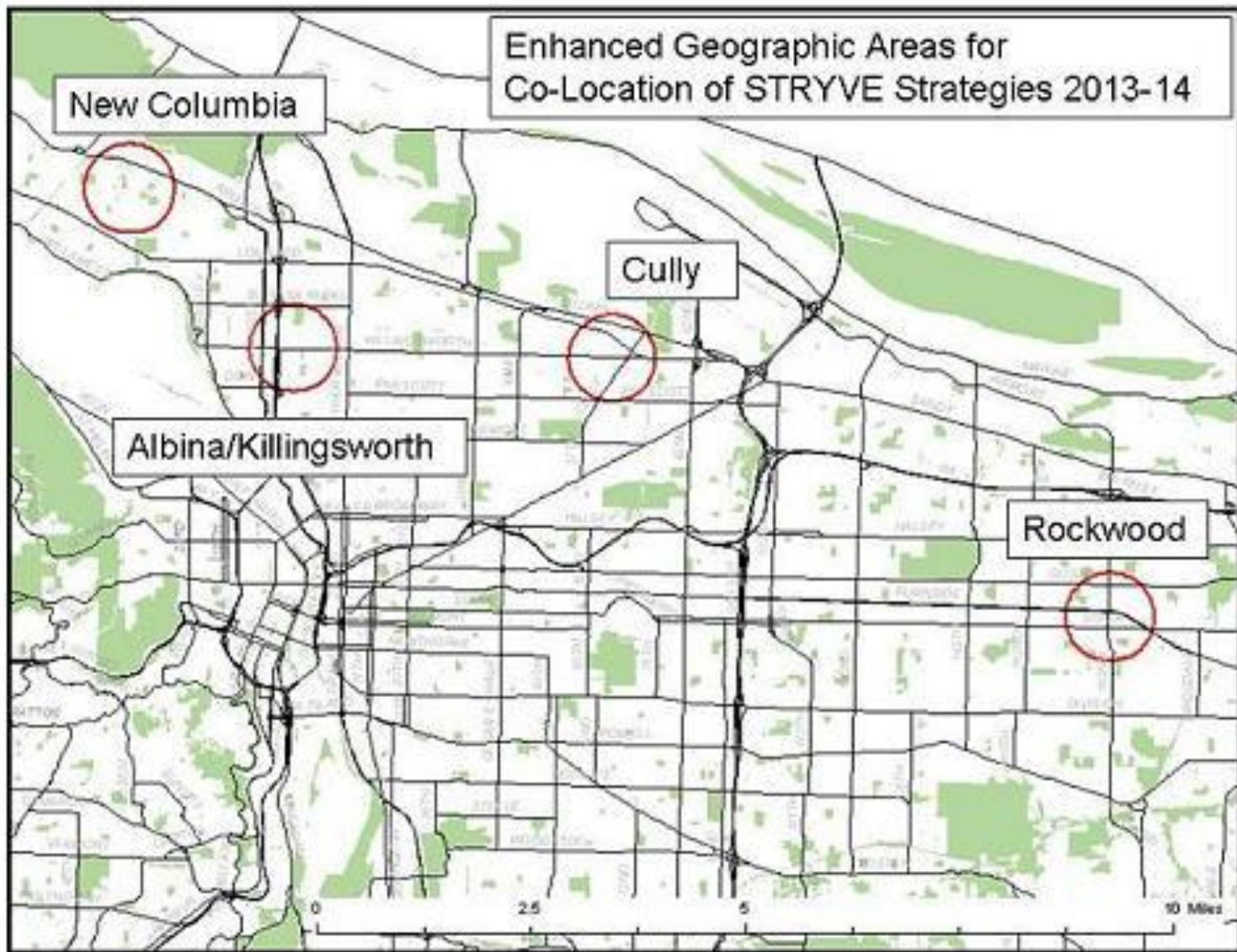
Enhanced Geographic Areas for

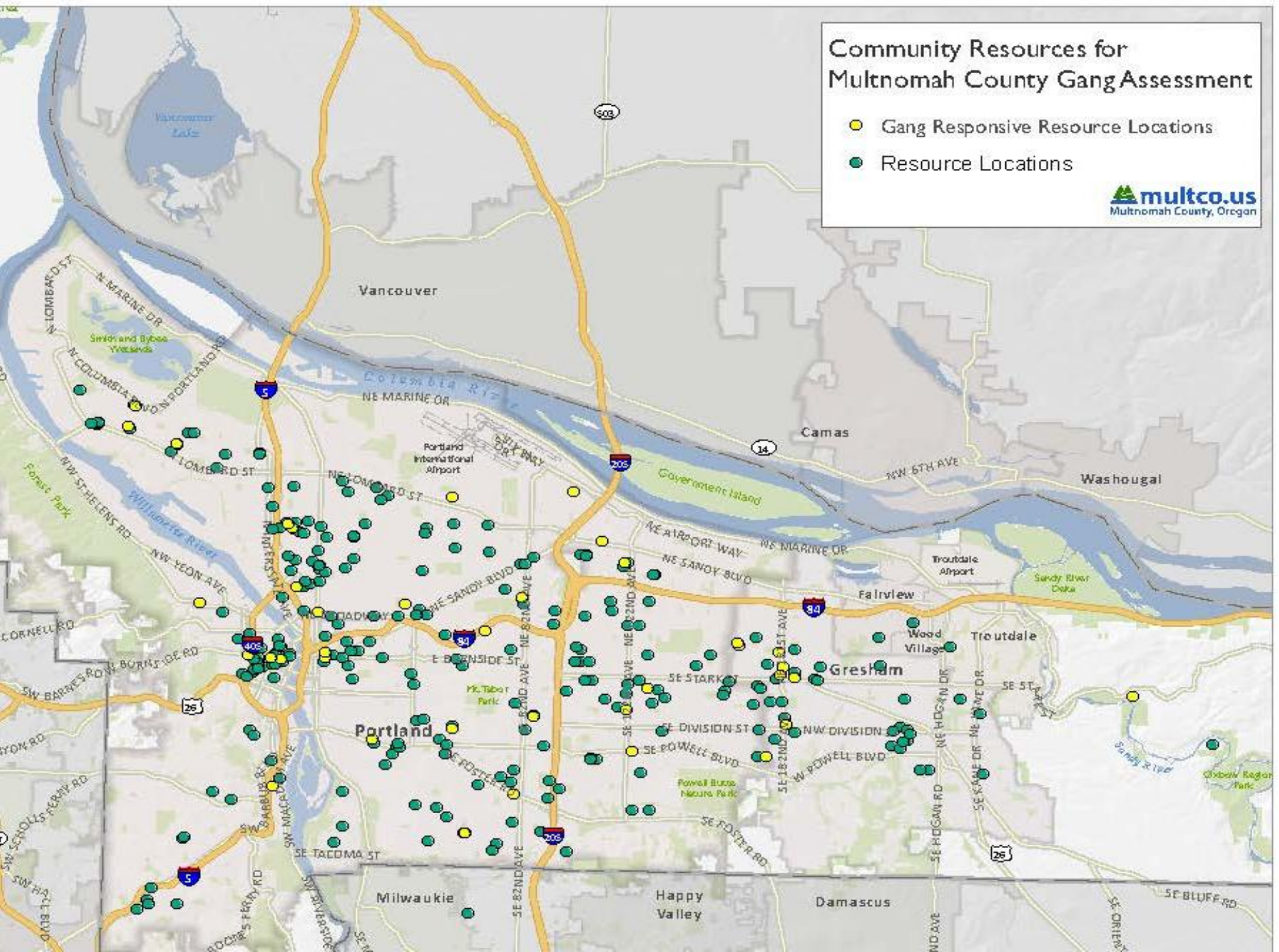
