Introductions, Announcements, and Approval of Minutes

Introductions were made.

Judge Nan Waller announced Barb Marcille is the permanent trial court administrator.

Multnomah County Gang Assessment Update

Abbey Stamp gave the background on the OJJDP Multnomah County Gang Assessment.

Roberta Phillip-Robbins provided a refresher on the OJJDP process, update on the work done since the assessment, the six strategies, the timeline, and other gang work being done around the county.

The Youth and Gang Violence Steering Committee is currently in the implementation planning phase and will be completed by December 2016.

The Steering Committee defined gang impacted, gang affiliated, and gang involved. Risk indicators were shared and displayed on a map, which show where upstream services are needed and where the target location(s) should be. The areas with greatest need were determined to be Portsmouth/New Columbia and an East County belt.

The Youth and Gang Violence Steering Committee identified six strategies:

- Links between police, youth, and community
- Connection to schools
- Employment opportunities
- Family engagement
- Mentoring
- Coordinating entry

Each strategy will have a workgroup to strategize about implementation. See the [presentation](#) for more information.

Christina McMahan suggested having a youth from OYA on the Coordinated Entry workgroup.

Examples of additional gang-focused efforts in Multnomah County were shared through the City of Portland Office of Youth Violence Prevention, Portland Police Bureau, East-County, Multnomah County Juvenile Services Division and Adult Services Division.

Anyone with concerns or objections should contact Roberta. Otherwise the strategies and direction were approved.

Department of Corrections Budget Update

As a follow-up from February's CJC presentation about opening Deer Ridge, DOC's Jeremiah Stromberg provided a budget update on the agency budget. Analysis of short-term transitional leave releases were reviewed. See the [presentation](#) for more detail.
