Kamesha Robinson & Dr. James Mason	 Challenges in the data especially for those that identify with more than one race. Separating out African Americans from African Immigrants. Generating data and information for African Americans statewide, CHLO. This model can be a model city in terms of how we generalize the data. Another challenge is that the data is aggregate, so if we were to disaggregate certain groups like API, there are certain groups who can have poorer outcomes, same with the African American population
