### **Executive Summary**

The High School Graduation Initiative will invest in new or existing efforts focused on high school graduation and college or career readiness. The efforts will ensure that County investments in high school supports are directed to students of color and in ways that promote graduation and strengthen existing efforts. In addition, more opportunities will be developed so that high school students at risk of not graduating will have supports and resources to graduate and transition to college and/or career readiness activities.

#### **Program Summary**

ISSUE: Multnomah County and Oregon have unacceptably low graduation rates, and for students of color these rates are persistently low. Non-graduating students face poor job prospects. Improving these rates is an economic imperative. Evidence on cost-effective ways to improve graduation rates is still evolving but generally points to the need to increase adult-student interactions. SUN Community Schools and other partners are poised to implement more targeted efforts that can foster these relationships.

PROGRAM GOAL: The goal is to improve graduation rates, and support college or career readiness, for students of color who are at risk of not graduating. Activities will center on engaging students and their families through focused, culturally responsive and specific approaches. There is evidence pointing to the success of connecting more adults (teachers, counselors, monitors, mentors) with high schoolers as a key strategy to boost school completion.

PROGRAM ACTIVITY: Activities will include: developing a targeted youth success coaching/advocacy model that builds from evidence-based dropout prevention models and local expertise in SUN Community Schools. A recent report by ECONorthwest highlights the importance of targeted or "narrowly focused" supports aimed at students most at risk for not graduating. Such activities may include: one-on-one coaching/mentoring, group based supports, focused classes, individualized tutoring, credit recovery, and/or post-high school college/career activities. Support to complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) will be another activity as it is a proven gateway to promote post-high school educational endeavors. Activities will intentionally create opportunities for more connections between youth and adults.
