Domestic and Sexual Violence Coordination Office 2016 - 2019 Strategic Plan Summary

BACKGROUND

The Domestic and Sexual Violence Coordination Office (DSVCO) was established in 1994. Located within the Department of County Human Services (DCHS), it is responsible for facilitating the development and coordination of effective domestic violence intervention and prevention strategies for the City of Portland, Multnomah County, and community agencies.

The DSVCO manages county, state, and federal funds for victim services, including crisis services, emergency shelter and shelter diversion, housing support, economic empowerment, legal services and culturally-specific services. Additionally, the DSVCO leads multi-disciplinary projects, assesses needs and gaps in local interventions, and provides training and capacity-building throughout the county. Over the past two years, staff from the DVCO have also been involved and committed to developing a

process for coordinated access to housing and shelter services in Multnomah County.

Multnomah County's response to domestic and sexual violence is guided by these objectives: prevention and education, safety, relationships and stability. These objectives frame how we strengthen and build our communities and help our neighbors heal.

The DSVCO strategic plan was created with input from multiple sources, including county leadership, the provider system, partner agencies, and survivor focus groups. The strategic plan will guide the work of DSVCO over the course of the next three years and serve as a benchmark to measure our success.

STRATEGIC PLAN: THREE AREAS OF FOCUS

The Strategic Plan identifies three major areas, or themes, on which to focus over the next 3 years:

- STRATEGIC PARTNERSHIPS STRENGTHEN DOMESTIC AND SEXUAL VIOLENCE RESPONSE
- 2. AWARENESS AND PREVENTION WORK STRENGTHENS COMMUNITY CAPACITY
- 3. SURVIVORS ACCESS SPECIALIZED DOMESTIC AND SEXUAL VIOLENCE SERVICES

1. STRATEGIC PARTNERSHIPS STRENGTHEN DOMESTIC AND SEXUAL VIOLENCE RESPONSE

DSVCO plays a significant role in convening system partners – both within and outside of the domestic and sexual violence system. The 2016 - 2019 goals for this area of focus will build on those relationships and extend their reach, especially into systems with which we might not yet collaborate.

2. AWARENESS AND PREVENTION WORK STRENGTHENS COMMUNITY CAPACITY

The Defending Childhood Initiative is the foundation for much of our ongoing work to reduce childhood exposure to violence. This initiative works with school districts, the county Health Department, and other programs and systems to educate professionals, parents and caregivers about Trauma-informed Practice, adverse childhood experiences, how to prevent children's exposure to violence, and promote resilience. DSVCO identified the following goals for 2016 - 2019:

Goal 1: Childhood Exposure to Violence and Trauma Is Reduced through Upstream Prevention Work

Goal 2: Domestic and Sexual Violence Is Reduced through Community Awareness and Norm Change

Goal 3: Community Members Are Integral to the Work to End Domestic and Sexual Violence

3. SURVIVORS ACCESS SPECIALIZED DOMESTIC AND SEXUAL VIOLENCE SERVICES

Domestic and sexual violence survivors' needs, identities, goals, backgrounds, styles, families, etc. define how each person approaches resources and services and what they might need to succeed. DSVCO will work to achieve the following goals during the period of 2016 - 2019:

Goal 1: Survivors Have Access to Culturally Specific and Responsive Support

Goal 2: Underserved Survivors Have Access to Equitable Support

Goal 3: Children and Youth Exposed to Violence and Trauma Get the Support They Need

Goal 4: Survivors' Sexual Assault Intervention Needs Are Met

Goal 5: Survivors Are Supported by Relationships Nurtured at Trauma-informed Organizations

Goal 6: Survivors' Crisis Response Needs Are Met

Goal 7: Survivors' Housing Needs Are Met

Goal 8: Survivors' Physical and Behavioral Health Care Needs Are Met

Goal 9: Survivors' Legal Services Needs Are Met

Goal 10: Survivors Are Economically Secure

Goal 11: Batterers Are Accountable

Each year, thousands of survivors and their children are safer because of the emergency services, housing, training and other support offered by the Multnomah County Domestic and Sexual Violence Coordination Office.
