Introductions, Announcements, and Approval of Minutes

Introductions were made and minutes were approved for December and January.

Judge Nan Waller announced another judicial listening session will be held Wednesday.

Abbey Stamp announced the What Works in Public Safety Conference and Justice Reinvestment Summit are Thursday and Friday.

Rod Underhill announced the county now has the first Multnomah Witness Intimidation Support program, which provides dedicated funding for witness relocation.

Abbey Stamp recognized Mary Geelan for her work on the Gang Assessment Implementation Plan.

Antoinnette Edwards thanked Mary Geelan and the Youth and Gang Violence Subcommittee members. She called attention to the posters of faces of victims of gang and gun violence.

Mary Geelan and Kirsten Snowden introduced the Multnomah County Comprehensive Gang Assessment and provided an overview of themes from the assessment, the Serving Public Safety Agencies in Multnomah County process, the goals, focus communities, and activities. The details can be found in the draft strategic plan.

Many parts of the <u>plan</u> are in progress. Currently, there is a need for project coordination, mentoring network, and customized Summer Works programs.

Mayor Ted Wheeler noted he wanted to focus on highest Return on Investment and to consider consolidating some non-profit organizations, as appropriate.

US Attorney Billy Williams urged we look for federal grants to fund the coordinator position.

The committee approved the plan.

The business and philanthropic community should be involved, and Mayor Wheeler offered to help.
