Introductions and Announcements

Introductions were made.

Kirsten Snowden noted the DA's Office Witness Support Program has been finalized.

Joe Walsh announced Gresham City now has a mentoring program within City Hall, and Gresham has a received a grant for 3 months of funding.

Lorena Campbell noted East County Caring Community is having an open house today at Gresham City Hall.

Antoinette Edwards announced the Aftershocks production on December 19th at 6:30pm. The flyer will be shared with the group.

Plan for new STRYVE and DCI Grants

Vanessa Micale provided an update. With six months to plan, one task is to update the Youth Violence Strategic Plan to include teen dating violence.

Erin Fairchild noted part of the DCI grant is to hire 2 community health workers to be part of the Violence Prevention Coordination Team, which will focus on racial justice and healing. The Violence Prevention Coordination Team will reside within LPSCC and is aligned with the OJJDP Gang Model. Members of the VPCT were shared.

Review Remaining Activities related to strategies

Antoinette Edwards read a letter from a concerned citizen about gangs.

Serving Public Safety Agencies in Multnomah County Within the Coordinated Entry strategy, Mary Geelan shared the recommended model for screening and referral to services. Tom Peavey noted funding is going to be the biggest barrier. There was discussion around police using the referral system. It was noted the benefit of this system is prioritization. Protected information will be a hurdle. There was discussion about budget and funding. Training expertise can still happen at a grassroots level. There may need to be a feasibility study around the process.

Family Engagement/Parent Partnership

There was discussion about the activity of talking to parents/parent advocates, MYC, gang outreach workers and community health workers about their ideas to engage and partner with gang-affected youth.

Discuss Measurements for Objectives
