Introductions and Announcements

Introductions were made and everyone shared their favorite animal.

Announcements:

- Alice Perry announced the Café at Gresham City Hall will be opening on April 7th.
- Alice Perry announced the final film of the Ollin: Justice Justice Series will be shown at the Hollywood Theater at 7:30 on Thursday, April 13th.
- Eric Zimmerman praised the work of POIC and noted their fundraising breakfast.
- Africa House is hosting a "Know Your Rights" workshop this Saturday, April 8th.
- The Multnomah Youth Commission (MYC) is recruiting for next year's commissioners.
 Applications are due April 27th. The MYC youth against violence has partnered with a foundation to give \$1000 grants to youth. The award ceremony is next week.
- On April 17th, members of the subcommittee will be presenting the gang plan to PPS.
- The film 13th was shown at LPSCC in March.
- On April 22nd OHSU and PSU are hosting a Gun Violence as a Public Health Issue Forum.
- Jeff Miller of Gresham Police offered a ride-along on Friday or Saturday nights.
- Latina Network is participating in an event at Mt. Hood Community College around family planning in case of detention.

Y&GV Subcommittee Focus

Abbey Stamp noted the subcommittee has focused on the gang plan for 3 years. This body will continue to provide oversight through implementation. There was discussion

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about the next focus. After group discussion, some themes for ongoing Y&GV work include (underlined items are action items):

- Youth involvement (in policy meetings, to policy-makers, and relationship-building, like noho's) and community voice (tap into existing groups), and <u>communicate the work we've</u> done with folks who were engaged in the first assessment
- Ongoing networking and information-sharing
- Institutionalize relationships, no matter what person represents a specific agency
- Monitoring the OJJDP gang plan implementation (pointed <u>accountability for each strategy</u>)
 -- particular energy noted on strategy 6
- Briefing on various types of violence and violence prevention work, from national policy to local climate
- More visuals to educate broader community, creating a narrative, especially with a focus on assets
- Continue ongoing learning about trauma and cultural responsivity.
- Continue value framework of trauma informed care and that youth and child behavior is often a symptom of their situation/environment.

Lily Yamamoto debriefed the implementation planning meeting. There is a follow up meeting this Tuesday, April 11th.

Christina will send out the list of implementation coordinators.

Each strategy may create its own charter. Lily will provide a sample charter.

On May 4^{th,} everyone should be ready to share their agency's violence prevention strategies.
