Introductions, Announcements, and Approval of Minutes

Introductions were made.

Jeff Howes, District Attorney's Office

The October minutes were approved.

Announcements:

- Abbey Stamp noted there will be SAMHSA-sponsored trauma-informed Train-The-Trainer events happening in the spring.
- Judge Ed Jones is retiring at the end of 2017.
- Judge Nan Waller noted preliminary hearings started the prior week.

Jail Use

Chief Mike Shults introduced Chief Deputies Nicole Morrisey O'Donnell and Derrick Pederson. The Chiefs presented how and why jail population has fluctuated over the last few months and how release decisions are made. For more details, see the <u>Jail Use Presentation</u>.

Judge Waller noted the new policy change of allowing the release of those with a risk (modified Virginia Pretrial Risk assessment instrument) score of 4 when there is an emergency release.

Community Corrections Plan

Scott Taylor presented the <u>2017-2019 Community Corrections Biennial Plan</u>. A <u>chart</u> with risk levels and recidivism in Oregon and in Multnomah County was discussed. As of today, the county is 17% below the state recidivism rate.

Director Taylor demonstrated the <u>Criminal Justice Commission's (CJC) dashboards</u> and encouraged people to explore the data.

The plan was approved by the committee and will be presented to the County Board of Commissioners on November 30th.

Re-entry Employment Services and Housing Assistance

Patrick Gihring, Patricia McLean, and Crystal Magana presented The Economic Opportunity Program (EOP) pilot program. For funding sources, career coaching provider partners, the EOP model, rent assistance information, racial analysis, employment, training, income outcomes, the return on investment, and systems alignment see the EOP presentation. Crystal Magana, an EOP participant, shared her story of incarceration, reentry, and job training.
