
Office of Community Involvement





About the Office of Community Involvement

Created by a vote of the people in 1984, the Office of Community Involvement was established by County Charter to facilitate direct communication between the people of Multhomah County and the Board of County Commissioners. We are committed to helping inform and involve communities in the processes that shape county policies, budgets, and programs.

The office also supports the Community Involvement Committee, made up of 15 volunteers who advise the county on timely, equitable and inclusive civic participation in county policy, and facilitate communication between the public and county government.

Highlights from FY 2016-17

The last fiscal year brought significant change and transition to the Office of Community Involvement and our work. Through the transition, staff continued to support our core programs and lay the groundwork for a new Director to lead the office. A few highlights:

- Supported 86 community members who served on the Community Involvement Committee and the nine Budget Advisory Committees
- Recruited 12 new members to the Community Involvement Committee
- Hired a new Executive Director, Dani Bernstein, who brings more than a decade of experience in advocacy, volunteer management and philanthropy to their role at the Office of Community Involvement
- Hosted the 2017 Volunteer Awards with over 150 volunteers and their families in attendance, where we honored 28 departmental volunteers and recognized several volunteers for their individual achievements

Looking Ahead


