Opioids: A Threat to Public Safety

The threat of opioids is evolving:

- Individuals dependent on pharmaceutical opioids transition to heroin
- Deaths from Fentanyl and synthetic opioids are on the rise, increasing 242% between the first ten months of 2016 and the equivalent period in 2017¹

Coordinated efforts:

 Law enforcement and county jails must coordinate with health professionals to ensure individuals suffering substance use disorders receive care

- Close Street Supervision (MCSO)

Facilities and Operational Use:

- Manage two facilities
 - Multnomah County Detention Center
 - Multnomah County Inverness Jail
- Dedicated, specialized housing
 - Treatment Readiness Dorm, Mental Health Units, and Medical Services
- Renovations
 - Eye towards safety, calming esthetics, and interaction
- Overarching Goal
 - Least restrictive housing assignments
 - Increase out of cell time
 - Facilitate time to manage life and access programming
