PROGRAM OPERATIONS

- Pre-booking Diversion
- Harm Reduction, Street Outreach model

PROGRAM OPERATIONS

- Referrals identified by PPB officers in the process of PCS arrest, or at risk of PCS arrest (social contact)
- Immediate warm handoff to Screening and Outreach Coordinator in the field or at the precinct
- Bi-monthly operations team meetings for case coordination and information sharing
- Regular collaboration in the field bike-alongs, text communication
- Ability to build trusting relationship in partnership PPB




LEAD® ENROLLMENT

- 99 participants enrolled since February 28, 2017
- 75 participants (77%) are on active status
- Inactive status:
 - 12 participants (12%) did not complete assessment (30 days for arrest referral/90 days for social contact)
 - 4 participants (4%) ineligible per DA post enrollment
 - 3 participants (3%) had no contact after 90 days
 - 1 participant moved out of state
 - 1 participant declined services
 - 1 participant deemed unsafe for continued services
 - 1 participant deceased




LEAD® EXPANSION – INNER EAST SIDE






REFERRAL TYPE






SELF-IDENTIFIED GENDER N=98






SEXUAL ORIENTATION N=98






RACE DEMOGRAPHICS N=98






ETHNICITY DEMOGRAPHICS N=98






SELF-IDENTIFIED PRIMARY SUBSTANCE N=98

PROGRESS TOWARD GOALS

- Legal Needs includes past warrants and citations (majority IPO citations or older FTA)
 - 81% (of 83 cases) resolved or in process with upcoming court dates
 - Allows for participants to clear minor cases and reduces impact on courts/DCJ
- Medical/Physical Health Needs stabilizing health and reducing EMS/ED usage
 - 93% (of 90 cases) resolved or engaged in care



Challenges with housing


- Criminal record

NEW PCS ARRESTS AND TREATMENT FIRST

- LEAD participants with a new PCS case are screened for Treatment First
- All have screened in the High/High quardrant
- Ability to staff the case in Ops Team discretionary
- Active engagement in STOP Court
- Option of a referral to STOP Court in addition to their involvement with LEAD
- Option for set-over
 - Allows clients to work solely with LEAD and probation for one year without attending STOP Court
