Explanation of Exceptions

→ Valid votes that have been marked by the voter outside the vote targets or using a marking device that cannot be read by the vote tally system shall not be included in making the determination whether the voting system has met the standard of acceptable performance for any precinct or ballot batch under ORS 254.529(7)(a) through (c) and are to be listed as exceptions.

Assumptions: Exceptions always affect two counts - the losing count and the gaining count. So in the totals above each exception listed below has been recorded twice with one half in the losing count and one half in the gaining count.

Governor:

Batch AB-1764 - A vote that was recorded for Beuhler was adjudicated by the hand count board to be an undervote. In this case the oval was filled in but the voter had crossed out Beuhler's name vigorously. The intent of the voter was outside the tally machine's readable area.

Judge:

Batch AB-0682 - In the initial adjudication there was a write-in that was incorrectly counted as an undervote because the adjudication board did not follow the adjudication rules. The hand count board, applying the adjudication rules correctly, determined that it was really a write-in.

Batch AB-1186 - On the initial adjudication one overvote was adjudicated as a vote for Aoyagi. The hand count board adjudicated it correctly as an overvote since the oval was filled in for Aoyagi and there was a different name written on the write-in line. The write-in oval was not filled in.

Measure 103:

Batch AB-0826: Voter used a hole punch to "remove" their Yes vote - On the scanned image it looked like it was filled in as well as the vote for no so it was initially adjudicated as an overvote. The hand count board decided it was a No vote.

Batch AB-0871: One No vote was initially adjudicated as a Yes vote on the initial count. The hand count board determined that it should have been adjudicated as a No vote.

Batch AB-1639: A ballot that was counted as a Yes vote was adjudicated by the hand count board to a No vote so they are calling it an exception. Marks showing voter intent were outside the readable area.
