


Environmental Justice // Defining Our Principals

KEX Portland:

- Gut renovation of 1911 Vivian Apartments (22,500 square feet)
- Energy efficiency, water efficiency, and seismic upgrades
- \$3.5MM CPACE investment of \$12.3MM redevelopment costs
- Energy performance projected to exceed current energy codes by 15%

Premier Gear:

- Gut renovation of 1944 manufacturing warehouse into Class A creative office space (42,000 square feet)
- \$3.5MM CPACE investment in seismic retrofit









- Greenhouse gas emissions decreased by 57%
- Water usage has decreased 19% per square foot
- County buildings are 4% more efficient per square foot
- 65% of all waste generated at the County is being diverted from the landfill
