Just Ask

1. Question: What food needs to be dated when placed in the freezer?

Answer: Food placed in the freezer that is not purchased frozen or does not have it's own expiration date. For example, bulk meats re-packaged at home and leftovers should be dated and the USDA recommendations should be followed for frozen food safety.

2. Question: If I am an operator that is a Qualified Entity Designee (QED) for background checks, do I need to notify ACHP when I complete a background check for my caregivers?

Answer: Yes, to be a qualified caregiver a person must have a ACHP approval letter. Please send your background check approval to the ACHP with the caregiver application. **Note:**

For housekeepers and volunteers for which you have completed the background checks you are required to keep, in your records, a copy of the approved background check, so it is available for inspection.

3. Question: I have been told that I am required to store dirty laundry in a covered container?

I reviewed MCAR 023-100-225 and found it confusing. What does "Soiled Linens" mean?

Answer: Soiled linens are dirty clothes, bed sheets and towels. In addition the rules state linens and clothing soiled by human waste shall be emptied daily, and promptly laundered.

The cost is \$50.00, the class is 4 full days 8:30 am to 4:30 pm and 1 test day with review from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm. Class dates are April 22, 25, 26, 29th with a test on the 30th. Pre-Service Dementia Training APD

There is a mandatory dementia care training that all APD direct care staff need to complete, prior to providing care.

Currently, there are only 2 approved classes:

- 2. Fundamentals of Dementia Care <u>https://oachp.org/</u>

All new providers (caregivers, resident managers and operators) are required to take one of the above classes before providing care. Current operators will be required to complete the training prior to their renewal date. However, all remaining APD providers will need to take the class by 12/30/2019.

The ACHP is expecting to have our own 3 hour Dementia Training.
