## I-5 AND I-205 TOLLING PROJECT UPDATE

- OTC directed ODOT to move forward with I-5 and I-205 Tolling projects
  - Convene the Equity and Mobility Advisory Committee (EMAC)
  - Stakeholder engagement
- Beginning environmental review for I-205 and additional planning for I-5 Tolling
- New Tolling Manager was hired
- Convening technical working groups: Regional Modeling Group (RMG) and Transit/Multimodal Working Group (TMWG)
- Coordination with regional partners and other pricing projects

## I-5 AND I-205 TOLLING PROJECTS: REVENUE GENERATION

- The price of the tolls and the times of day when tolls may be in place have not been determined
  - This will be determined during project development
- HB 2017 established the Congestion Relief Fund within the Highway Trust Fund
  - Constitutional restriction on Highway Trust Fund expenditures
- Congestion Relief Fund would be spent on roadway projects, which could include:
  - Travel lanes
  - Bicycle and pedestrian facilities
  - Transit improvements in or along the roadway (e.g. enhanced transit stops)






#### OREGON TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION DECISION-MAKING

- The OTC will approve the following:
  - Project goals and objectives
  - Equity framework
  - Performance measures
  - Range of alternatives and the preferred alternative
  - Community mobility and equity strategies to incorporate into the project
  - Toll rates and initiation of tolling

## **OUR START TO INCORPORATING EQUITY**

- Our approach is centered on both process and outcome equity
- ODOT is prioritizing community mobility and equity strategies as key components of a successful tolling project.
  - Equity and Mobility Advisory
    Committee will play a *critical* role

#### **Equity and Mobility Advisory Committee**

Non-elected representatives from Oregon and SW Washington:

- Local agency equity representatives
- Transit and transportation mobility and equity representatives
- Historically underserved community representatives
  - Local neighborhoods
  - Limited English proficiency
  - Communities of color and low-income populations
  - People with disabilities
  - Shift workers, employees
- FHWA (ex-officio)





## OUR START TO INCORPORATING EQUITY


#### What we've accomplished:

- Contracted with TransForm, a national leader in equitable pricing programs to develop an equity strategy for the project
- Conducted equity training for project staff
- Developing Equity Framework to guide project staff in incorporating equity considerations:
  Equity and Mobility Advisory Committee (EMAC) will finalize
- Planning targeted engagement activities to ensure we include the voices of historically underserved communities; utilizing community engagement liaisons






## TRANSFORM'S MODEL: FIVE STEPS TOWARD EQUITABLE OUTCOMES
