


#### Public Health

### Public Health: Leading Causes of Death Policy Development, Analysis & Prioritization



# Public Health COVID 19 Impacts - FY 2020 and FY 2021 and beyond

- Serious amplification of existing racial and ethnic health and economic inequities will increase demand for short and long-term public health prevention work
- Long-term need for core Public Health work through the pandemic and recovery-policy guidance, communications, partnering with community



# Public Health COVID 19 Impacts - FY 2020 and FY 2021 and beyond

- Revenue impact to maternal child and family health home visiting work-moving to telehealth services has large impact on Medicaid revenue
- Revenue impact to License & Inspection Fees for restaurants, lodging, pools, schools, cafeterias, tobacco retailers
- Potential for 8.5% reduction of State funds Direct State funding is 24% of Public Health Division budget; Fed thru State funding is 9%
