- The Vance site is 90 acres and includes Vance Park, a former quarry mine, and the Multnomah County Yeon Building.
- · The entire site is owned and managed by Multnomah County.

- There are no current safety risks to the neighboring areas and the contamination is being monitored





This will be a multi-year development process and we want to engage the community every step of the way. We are working with 12 Community Leaders who represent the area's racially diverse, multilingual neighborhoods. They will be speaking with their communities about the project and ideas for the site's future in August and September 2020!
