Hello Glynn,

I am checking in as I will likely need to send notice out soon for the September Hearing. As it currently stands, the COVID-19 situation at the County remains unchanged. We do not anticipate opening up the Yeon building to the public in the near future. We have heard from some other agencies (City of Portland, City of Gresham, etc) they do not anticipate opening up their buildings and having employees return to office work until after the new year. We will likely be in a similar position as those other agencies.

So this presents some issues as I know you would prefer to have an in-person hearing. As it stands there are essentially two options that I see:

1. Delay the hearing until October with another extension
2. Proceed with a video conference hearing in September as scheduled

One additional piece of information, there is a limit to the amount of extensions that can be requested. The limit is 215 days, which you have already used 178 days (52, 63, 63).

Let me know your thoughts on the matter and I hope you are well and safe,
