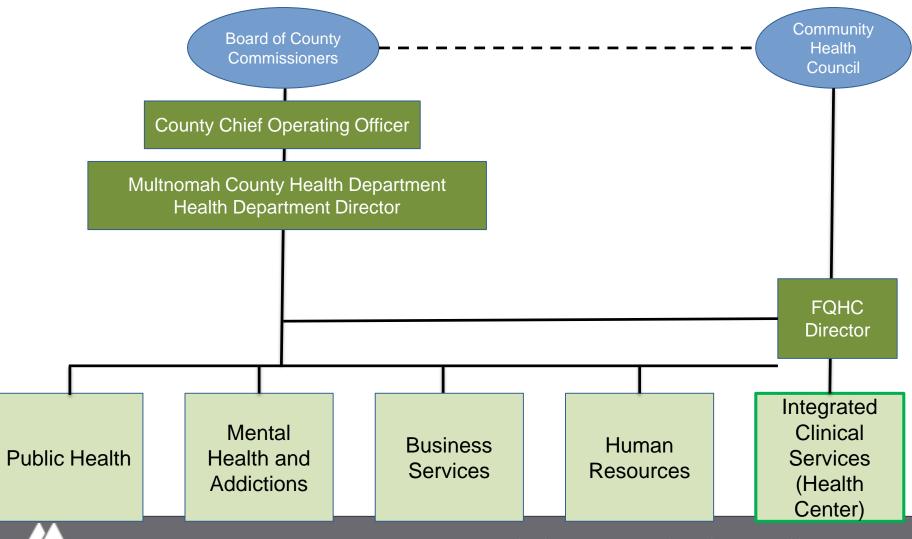

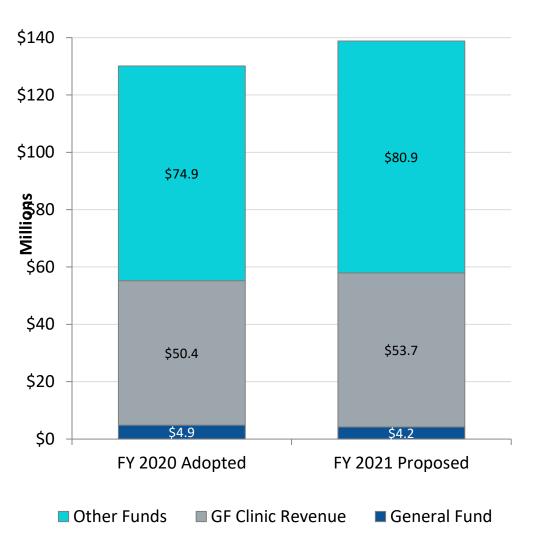
Integrated Clinical Services

- 63,726 patients and 274,300 visits for primary care and dental services
- 79% of clients live below the federal poverty line (\$12,000 per year)
- 76% of clients are on Medicaid or the Children's Health Insurance Program
- 3,000 clients report unstable housing
- 62% of patients identify as a Person of Color
- 45% of patients English is their secondary language





Integrated Clinical Services



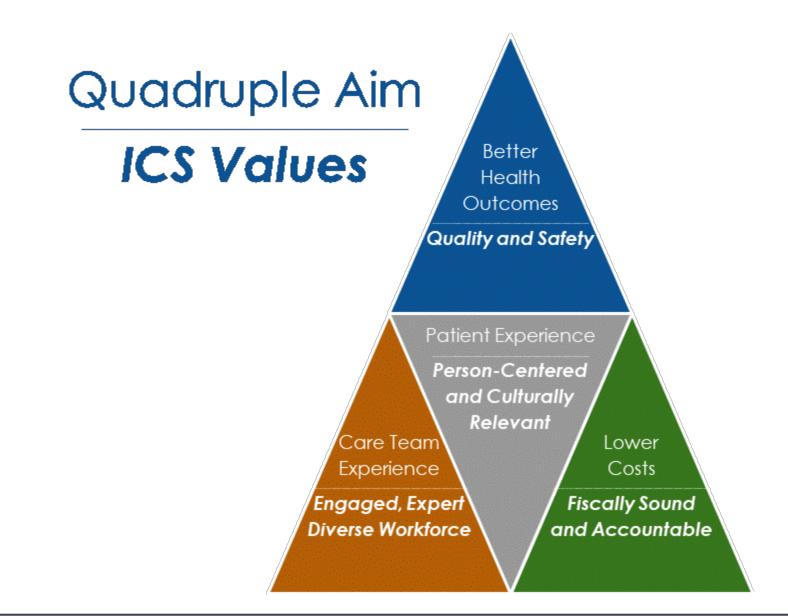
- General Funds decreased by \$700,000
- GF Clinic Revenue increased by \$2.7M
- Other Funds increased by \$6M
- 21.85 FTE net increase in Integrated Clinical Services



Integrated Clinical Services: Health Equity and Health Promotion

- Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) to address food access and nutrition education.
- Refugee clinic providing affordable care to new community members.
- Empezando con Salud in East County to support Latinx families
- In partnership with Public Health provided low barrier COVID 19 testing in response to an outbreak.
- SOGI Project to ensure inclusive care.







Integrated Clinical Services COVID 19 Impacts - FY 2020 and FY 2021

Successes

- Implemented Incident Command Center to direct strategic decision making
- Swift transition to regional model, maintaining patient care while limiting disease spread
- Introduced tele-dentistry
- COVID 19 testing across clinic sites to existing patients
- Centralized Eligibility Specialists
- Expanded virtual visits
- Curbside pharmacy

Integrated Clinical Services COVID 19 Impacts - FY 2020 and FY 2021

Financial Impact

- Clinic revenue has been impacted by reduced access to services
- New HRSA COVID 19 grants: \$2.9 million
- Maintaining current projections for FY21 budget, with clinics resuming normal operations in July

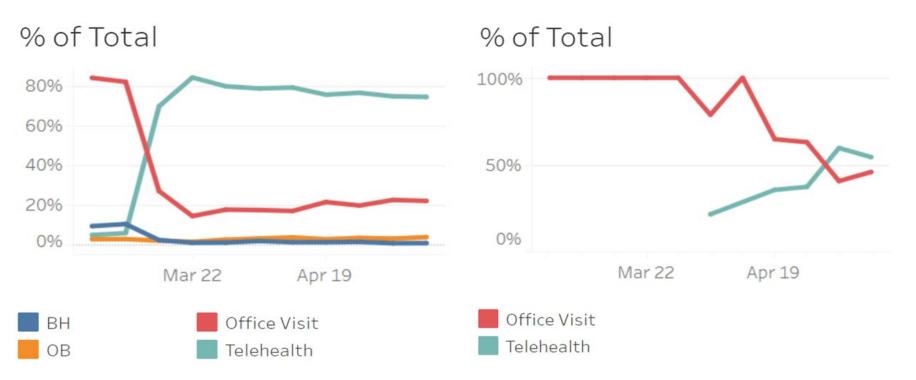


Integrated Clinical Services COVID 19 Impacts - FY 2020 and FY 2021

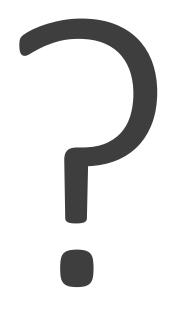
