		apply and enforce the mask, face covering and face shield guidance, and physical
		distancing requirements in state COVID-19 guidance to all individuals, regardless
		of vaccination status, and must continue to do so if they do not have a policy for
		checking proof of vaccination or have not reviewed proof of vaccination for an
		individual, or if the individual has declined to provide such proof.
