

Rent Assistance in Multnomah County: Definition of Terms

Emergency: responding to pandemic crisis; specific allocation for this purpose

Short Term: less than 2 years, with support services

Long Term: ongoing support

JOHS & DCHS: Rent Assistance

JOHS

Focuses on supporting placement and retention for those experiencing homlessness, including supportive housing and long term rent assistance.

DCHS

Focuses on housing stability and homelessness prevention, providing rent assistance & support for those who are unstably housed or at risk of homelessness.
