Executive Summary

The Violation Hearings Unit provides effective interventions and helps to ensure necessary due process and efficient operations of the local justice system. In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, a parole-probation officer (PPO) and office assistant senior were funded to provide additional support to address jail sanctions in a timely manner in an effort to lower the census of the jail. This offer provides ongoing funding for these positions.

Program Summary

The FY 2021 budget provided funding for DCJ to pilot a Notice of Rights PPO position and office assistant senior to have direct access to justice-involved individuals (JIIs) who are awaiting a sanction in jail to address violations to supervision. Prior to this funding, DCJ did not have a PPO in the jail to connect with the JII, which delayed the time it took to process sanctions. Having the capacity to have these positions in the jail decreases the time it takes to gather the info to process the sanction as well as provide the notice of rights that is required to be compliant with State due process laws.

Continuing to fund these positions will benefit Black, Indigenous, and People of Color (BIPOC) communities, who are overrepresented in jail, by decreasing their length of stay.
